## The blessings of summer

Summer is such a special time of the year. As children, we all looked forward to the warm weather, the days away from school and the opportunities to spend time with family and friends. I look back fondly on all the adventures in the woods, swimming in the river and at our family camp on a small pond, and being out until dusk, drinking in the freedom that the season provided. As an adult, I don't have the same opportunity for boundless free time as once afforded us, but I can live vicariously through my kids as they enjoy the time away from school and making memories that will last a lifetime.

Here at Grace Church, this summer promises to be a special time. We continue to be blessed with supply priests to lead our Eucharist each Sunday. It is interesting to hear different voices and approaches each week, as it allows us an opportunity to understand what it is we are looking for as a parish in our future rector. Along those lines, please keep Rev. Martha Tucker and Rev. Edwin Johnson and their families in your prayers. Both have become members of the Grace Church family, by virtue of their generosity in spending time at our church and leading our services, and both are in need of our prayers and support. In addition to ensuring services are held each Sunday, the vestry, parish administrator and other dedicated volunteers have been working very hard behind the scenes to ensure the physical church remains 'up to snuff' and available for our use each Sunday. At times it feels like there is something new to deal with each day, but with patience and grace we are working through the challenges that come with aging infrastructure. Here are just a few examples of the progress made in the past few months.

- Starting late last year and continuing into this year, there has been a string of leaks that appeared in the vicinity of the sacristy and the information table outside the nave. Based on the increasing frequency of leaks and the age of the church roof, the decision was made to move ahead with a roof replacement. The work will be completed by Robert Kierce Roofing, out of Foxboro, and is currently scheduled to happen in the first week of September. Once the work is complete, churchgoers and building users should not have to worry about leaks for years to come.
- To both improve the appearance of the church grounds and to avoid burning out our dedicated volunteers who commit their time, we have engaged Dylan Maresco Landscaping for biweekly mowing services on the church and rectory grounds. Mr. Maresco is highly regarded by several members of the parish, and we are happy to have his company keeping the grounds looking fresh and sharp through the summer

and fall.

- Having acquired new ovens for the kitchen, the vestry continues to move toward making the facility viable for commercial use. A long overdue inspection of the fire suppression system in the church kitchen uncovered necessary repairs and upgrades. The vestry has engaged Gorham Fire Equipment to complete the necessary repairs, which will occur in July. Once complete, discussions will continue with a potential user for the space, bringing some much-needed revenue to the church.
- A significant number of trees were removed from the edge of the church property that borders 17 and 25 Bruce Road, due to unsafe conditions and requests by the homeowners. This effort is the first, and most likely not the last, tree removal effort required on the property. There are many older trees that have fallen and/or need removal around the property. The vestry will be working to identify and address them as time and funding permits in the coming years.
- As mentioned in recent midweek emails, thanks to Chris Jordan there will be a junk removal day scheduled for late July or early August. This will allow us to remove old, unnecessary equipment, tools, decorations, yard sale items, etc. that have started to fill the church and the garage. If you know of anything that should go, please move it to the garage or let the office know by July 21<sup>st</sup> so it can be taken. This is a great opportunity to free up valuable space in the church and create a better atmosphere to conduct our ministries.

The vestry and this newsletter will be taking a well-deserved summer break in August, so look for both to return in September. In the meantime, I wanted to leave you with a celebration of summer and all its blessings. I hope you and yours have a wonderful summer season and that we see you in the fall!
